**Fall Gardening with American Beauties:
Native Plants for the Birds and Bees**



Adding more native wildflowers, trees and shrubs to your garden can make a huge difference to our local wildlife and support migrating songbirds and butterflies, particularly monarchs.

This course will include a lecture and a wildflower meadow walk where you will see stunningly beautiful native New England late season wildflower combinations that you can easily replicate at home.

- Learn how to gently prepare your yard for winter to protect over-wintering beneficial insects.
- With cooler days, fall is a great time for planting and from early fall to when the ground freezes (Dec) you have time to add more native trees, shrubs and wildflowers.
- Learn key plants to add for winter interest that both you and the birds and bees will enjoy.

As we domesticate the landscape, we need to create more native plant habitat.
